KIB BOARD MEMBER ACTIVITIES

On October 14, KIB Board Members Margie Stipes and Rachel Moon, along with Rick Hose and Julie Schmitt, conducted the annual Community Appearance Index (CAI). KIB has performed this survey (formerly known as the Litter Index) since 2001, and it is one of the many requirements for maintaining the President's Circle level with Keep America Beautiful. The same routes are driven each year, with the participants scoring areas on a 1 to 4 scale based on the amount of litter visible. The scores are then compared to the original baseline data. Good news: litter in Irving has decreased by 38.4% from our original survey in 2001.
