# Behind the Scenes at the Trash-Off

KIB recently held its annual spring cleanup, the "Don't Mess with Texas Trash-Off," where 213 volunteers gathered at Trinity View Park with the common goal of making our community cleaner and greener. The event was a big success, and ran quite smoothly, but what you might not realize is that a lot of work goes in to making that happen. Months of planning take place, starting with reserving the location and date with the Parks Department, requesting a roll-off container from Solid Waste Services, setting up online registration and promoting the event through traditional and social media outlets.

As volunteers arrive at the park, their first stop is the sign-in table, staffed with seasoned KIB veterans Elouise McMillian, Nancy Medina, Meg Mueller and Lisa Ross. This team made sure that everyone had the proper signed release forms, then directed them to the supply tables. A mix of North Lake College Phi Theta Kappa and Service Learning students distributed vests, gloves, trash and recycle bags, and litter pickers to the cleanup crews. They were then sent to the first aid area where KIB Board member Scott Wilson gave them instructions and a safety speech. As the volunteers were cleaning up throughout the park, Code Officer Luz Zavala, assisted by Cary Birdwell, drove the roadways and collected full bags of trash or recyclables and delivered them to the collection area. At the end of the cleanup, volunteers were treated to a hot dog lunch, prepared and served by another veteran team made up of several city employee volunteers, led by Code Manager

#### Did You Know?

The Don't Mess with Texas Trash-Off engages Texans in a variety of activities to help keep our state clean, and is also part of the Great American Cleanup. The statewide results from 2016 were:

- 1,359 events
- 34,191 volunteers
- 3,957 miles of road cleaned
- 1.5 million pounds of litter collected

The nationwide Great American Cleanup results (March 1 - May 31) were:

- 40,000 community events
- 5.4 million volunteers
- 100,000 miles of road and shoreline
  - 62 million pounds of litter and debris
