KIB Partners with Aquatics for Summer

Summers for Keep Irving Beautiful (KIB) are usually filled with projects where we work with a variety of volunteers from corporate, faith, civic or youth groups. This year the KIB staff has stayed busy by adjusting their schedules to a new parameter and working with City of Irving staff instead of large volunteer groups. We continued to partner with the city's Recreation team, specifically the Heritage Senior Center Staff, who painted the fencing which leads to the walking trails at Lively Park.

After the closing of pool facilities, we started partnering with the City of Irving Aquatics Department and were matched with three staff members who typically work as lifeguards. This group has taken on the task of adding a fresh coat of bright white paint to the safety fencing that surrounds Senter Pool. They also have been working on projects at the KIB offices, including making no-sew blankets for donation. We look forward to seeing all we can accomplish together this summer.

KIB was active in the planning for the Keep Texas Beautiful Regional Training, and served as one of the co-hosts for this online event. Affiliates from North Texas cities joined each Wednesday from July 8 to 29 to hear sessions on different topics, including KIB's presentation on the Adopt-a-Spot program.
