KIB Volunteers Serve in Many Ways

KIB opened the month of May by partnering with Star Park Las Colinas, a new Lincoln Property Company apartment community, for a beautification project. Four Star Park employee volunteers met KIB staff at the Fritz Park Petting Farm on May 6 to take on the fun task of painting the entrance to this popular Irving attraction. After 14 combined hours of service, the barn-like structure now shines with a new coat of bright red paint and white trim.

Several groups and individuals partnered with KIB to make "no-sew" blankets in May. KIB's Blanket Project is an ongoing service to the community which has brought our volunteers in touch with numerous area organizations who receive these blankets. Girl Scouts from Daisy Troop 574, who first worked with KIB at their Mustang Park cleanup in April, added to their service by making four of the blankets which they donated to The Main Place. Three Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints missionaries made blankets which were donated to Irving Cares, and blankets from members of the Baha'i Irving Community were donated to the Carol Susat Family Advocacy Center. We also love to have individuals help with the blankets, like Girl Scout Mikayla King, who made two blankets on her own.
