## EARTH MONTH A BIG SUCCESS

April started on a rainy note, and our annual spring cleanup, the Don't Mess with Texas Trash-Off, had to be rescheduled due to wet conditions at the park and the threat of more rains. A unique feature of this year's celebration was the sealing of a time capsule to be opened in 2058, in commemoration of North Lake's 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary. We wrapped up the month by getting a cleanup in, this one with a group of Geocachers, who looked for hidden "caches" while collecting trash and recyclables at Spring Trails Park on In addition to KIB's busy April, the city offered several April 29. environmental themed activities, like Arbor Day at Heritage Park, and Bicycle Fest at North Lake, and KIB provided supplies to our friend from the Irving Lake Association for their Spring cleanup of Lake Vilbig on April 28.

KIB received some great news from Keep Texas Beautiful and the Texas Deaprtment of Transportation – Irving was declared the winner of the 2018 Governor's Community Achievement Award for the largest population category. This is the fourth time Irving has won this prestigious honor, and it comes with a \$310,000 landscape grant to be used along a TxDOT-maintained highway. This will be presented at the Keep Texas Beautiful Conference in Georgetown on June 12. In addition, the City of Irving Water Utilities Department won First Place in the Government Program category.
