Did You Know?

Here are ways to save energy that you might not have thought about, courtesy of Earth 911:

- Placing things that heat up, like lamps or TVs, near your thermostat sensor can cause the air conditioner to run longer than necessary because the thermostat senses heat from the appliances. Rearrange those items to save energy.
- Plugging electronics into a power strip makes it more convenient to switch everything off at once, saving up to 12% on your energy bill.
- Don't close heat registers in rooms you aren't using if you have a forced-air furnace. The furnace can't sense this, and still works as hard, plus cold air from those rooms escapes into other areas, decreasing the effectiveness of your insulation and weatherizing efforts.
